# WEEKLY BUSINESS MEETING MINUTES January 22, 2020

#### 1. CALL TO ORDER & PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The meeting was called to order by Chair Paasch at 8:46 a.m. Present were Chair Christopher Paasch, Vice-Chair Court Boice, Commissioner Sue Gold.

Also present: Legal Counsel John Huttl, Director of Operations Julie Schmelzer, Administrative Assistant John Jezuit.

The Pledge was recited by all

#### 2. LINE OF DUTY CASUALTY REPORT

Boice gave the report.

#### 3. AMENDMENT/APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA

Motion by Boice, second by Gold, to approve the agenda as written. Motion carried unanimously.

#### 4. PUBLIC COMMENTS

David Barnes spoke about CCH (Curry Community Health) Board member. Huttl advised the County is litigation with CCH. Gordon Clay spoke about the Suicide Awareness and Prevention Council applicants' background, their qualifications, each position, and need for Mayor and faith based applicants. Representative David Brock Smith gave an update on the legislative session, specifically, carbon emissions tax legislation. Smith also spoke about gun legislation, the SOD (Sudden Oak Death) meeting in Bandon on January 21, 2020, and concerns about a different strain hitting the Rogue River.

#### 7. PRESENTATIONS

A. PAF (Personnel Action Form) Presentation to the Board – Julie Swift, Payroll & Personnel Coordinator

Swift explained final step in hiring process for two (2) applicants.

Motion by Gold, second by Boice, to complete the hiring process. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Gold, second by Boice, to approve Consent Agenda as written. Motion carried unanimously.

#### 9. **DISCUSSION/ACTION ITEMS**

A. Approve: Final Order Adams Appeal #AD-1907/A-1901 – Becky Crockett, Planning Director Schmelzer summarized the final order. Boice, citing issues with the river, stated the gravel extraction will resolve those issues and also stated he feels bad for Ron Adams, a Vietnam veteran, as Ron Adams put a lot of work into the application. Paasch is in full agreement about need to resolve issues with the river and noted proper documentation is needed to move forward.

Motion Gold, seconded by Paasch, to approve the Planning Commission recommendation. Motion carried 2-1 (Gold, Yes; Paasch, Yes; and Boice, No).

B. Appoint: Parks Liaison – Julie Schmelzer, DOC (Director of County Operations) Schmelzer summarized the need for the Board to appoint a commissioner liaison for the Parks Department stating this has been discussed at the January 15, 2020 Board meeting. Boice spoke at length about his long term interest and support of the Parks Department.

Motion by Paasch, second by Gold, to appoint Boice as Parks liaison. Motion carried unanimously.

C. Appoint: Members to the Suicide Awareness and Prevention Council – Julie Schmelzer, DOC Schmelzer explained the steps taken to get to this point in the process. Citizen and suicide awareness advocate Gordon Clay had shared his recommendations for the appointments to the Council.

Motion by Gold, seconded by Boice to appoint Gordon Clay's recommendations. Motion carried unanimously.

D. Approve: Off-Shore Wind Energy Research – Commissioner Boice
Boice spoke about the natural advantages the southern Oregon coast has for this pilot project,
specifically, the consistent winds and the deep water, and stated he did not want Curry County to
appear short sighted on off shore wind energy research. A discussion ensued. David Barnes
expressed concern about the viability of the pilot project due to wave heights, stated the power
generated will go to Humboldt Bay, and recommends a workshop to further discuss the matter. Gold
asked about cost of research. Paasch stated he is not in favor of wind energy.

Motion by Boice, second by Gold, to support this with the understanding Curry County has nothing to pay. Motion carried unanimously.

Boice read the first two (2) paragraphs of the letter.

Motion by Paasch, second by Gold to approve Boice's letter of support. Motion carried unanimously.

### 11. DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Schmelzer spoke about

- Emily Rumiano resignation from the CRTF (Citizens Revenue Task Force);
- Using the CRTF to evaluate and further study ideas generated by past County advisory groups;
- The Water Master will hold office hours in the Community Development Department;
- Scheduled meetings to get feedback on the strategic plan prior to adoption with the goal of Board action by mid-February, 2020;
- Wage study issues;
- County properties for sale and asking Josh Hopkins, Parks Director, to help with property evaluation;
- Hopkins research which led to discovery that Oasis Park in City of Brookings on Hillside and Hwy 101 is owned by the county;
- Changes due to resignation of Finance Director may include a reorganization with possibility of making the position part of the Administrative Services Department; and
- The analyzing of County uses for the Rush Building is being put on hold as the timeline is too short to get into the budget.

### 12. COMMISSIONER UPDATES

- A. Commissioner Boice spoke about
  - CRTF and stated he doesn't know what else there is to discuss because we are not raising taxes:
  - Harvesting timber, not burning it;
  - A better report on Senator Wyden's endowment that he will give down the road;
  - Wanting to have a plan to present to the Board where the Road Department purchases a building and rents it to ODOT (Oregon Department of Transportation) as ODOT has no office space in Curry County;
  - SOD and the very detailed information provided at yesterday's meeting;
  - The August, 2021 US Track and Field championships in Eugene and possible opportunities for the County. He will have more on this later;
  - Bandon Dunes USGA (United States Golf Association) Amateur championship event with thousands of people coming to the event. He will have more on this later; and
  - Supporting, on January 24, 2020 in North Bend, the opening by Oregon Community Action of Veterans Housing called Deer Springs Terrace as it is a tremendous success story.
