

Commissioner Court Boice -- Sourcing funds – assisting to help build our County. Successful accumulations to date: (2017 – 2019).

Secured:

\$ 2.0 million -- (State) 2019 South Curry Emergency Room Facility – finding funds along with Brock Smith and Heard

\$ 1.7 million – (State) 2019 -- Curry Sudden Oak Death Funding – (S.O.D.) Brock Smith – Boice serves on the S.O.D. Task Force

\$ 1.7 million – (Federal) 2018 -- P.I.L.T. (Payment in Lieu of Taxes) Funds to Curry – Worked closely with Congressman Greg Walden, AOC (Association of Oregon Counties), AOCC (Association of O&C – BLM 18 Counties)

\$ 1.6 million – (Federal) 2019 -- P.I.L.T. Payment to Curry – Worked closely with Congressman Greg Walden, AOC, AOCC and other Southern Oregon County Partners – resulting in an 80% increase over previous funding.

\$ 1.6 million -- (State) 2019 -- Port of Port Orford Infrastructure Funding -- Brock Smith and Heard

\$ 1.2 million – (Federal) 2019 Curry Sudden Oak Death Funding – (S.O.D) Brock Smith, Merkley

Funds Recovered:

\$ 1.6 million -- (Federal-State Pass through – CDBG) 2018 Head Start Funds Rescued from previous CC Board preference to return funds.

\$ 100 K – (State-Non-Profit) 2017 All Care Funds Rescued from previous CC Board preference to return funds.

Association of O&C Counties – Recent Legal Victories in Federal Court – Commissioner Boice serves on the AOCC Board of Directors. These wins and the Court Boice insistence that Curry remain and participate in the AOCC efforts to bring stable sensible Forest management – hence significant sustainable revenue back to Curry indefinitely.

Negotiated Savings:

\$ 2.2 million – Adjustment – Oregon Department of Forestry, Lobster Creek Fire costs down to \$50 K – Boice contribution – Mediated Law Suit Settlement - final

agreement – highlighting amount Curry County saved from potential legal loss - Collaboration with Counsel and County Insurance Services.

\$ 40 K -- (Private-Public-Non Profit) Ford Family Foundation, Curry – PARC Resources -- Community Assistance Grant Fund – developing Curry Based Strategies – applications and full funding for various priorities. Incorporating with the Curry 5-year Strategy - anticipated and following Work Sessions determining Curry interests and needs. Ensure that Curry has the capacity to submit multiple disaster relief requests. Identify other grant resources available for each project and encourage local Curry County partners and community leaders to seek these additional funds out of this process using the leverage of the disaster funds. Part of Ford strategy would be to “increase Curry County access to federal, state and private funds” by creating a solid foundation of opportunities to complete as many projects as possible.
